HOW TO PREP FOR WINTER WEATHER



Prioritize:

Advance plan and prepare to keep people safe — provide safety training, assign responsibilities, establish communication procedures and prepare emergency kits. Make sure your emergency supplies are accessible and stockpile essentials such as blankets, shovels or de-icing materials, flashlights, extra batteries, first aid supplies, non-perishable food, water and portable chargers.



Review:

Look over insurance coverage & business continuity plans to restore critical operations when weather disrupts your business. If in doubt, contact your insurance provider to review your current policies and discuss ways to reduce the risk of property damage.



Evaluate:

Monitor the winter conditions in your area and ensure you have adequate supplies and an optimized staff schedule based on the forecasts. Stay informed about transportation and supply chain impacts and communicate these to employees and customers.



Protect:

Keep structural and mechanical components in good condition; use insulation and temperature controls; keep valuables and important documents safe and away from potential damage. Consider weatherproofing doors and windows ahead of potential winter storms to reduce the risk of damage.
